TITLE Draft 2023/2024 Regional Plan and Budget

According to Part 3.3 of the Local Government Act 2019, the Council is obligated to formulate and approve a Regional Plan for the upcoming financial year. This must be done between the dates of 01 March and 30 June of the preceding financial year.

BACKGROUND

The Regional Plan has been developed with consultation across Tiwi Islands Regional Council, operational and non-operational areas. The final version will be submitted to the Northern Territory Government by 30 June 2022.

As a requirement of the Regional Plan development process, the Council must conduct a formal evaluation and endorsement of the draft version of the Plan. Subsequently, it is necessary for the Council to decide to initiate a period of public consultation, which should span no fewer than 21 days.

The Council is requested to review and approve the draft regional plan, and subsequently resolve to commence a formal consultation period that lasts for a minimum of 21 days.

The draft plan will be distributed as a handout on the day of the meeting due to size.

ISSUES/OPTIONS/CONSEQUENCES

This is a legal requirement for all Councils to submit a plan for each financial year.
